to 1:30PM**



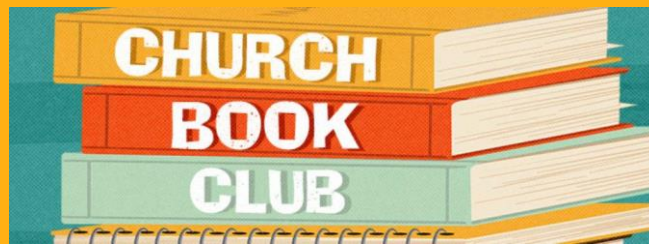
Description: The situation of Indigenous Americans will be examined, beginning with the pre-Columbian historical context and the initiation and impact of the Doctrine of Discovery.

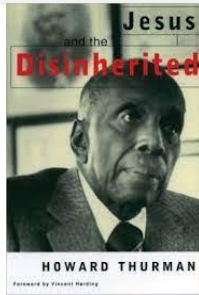

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

You may be eligible to receive the COVID vaccination now under Phase 1A, 1B, & 1C. Your eligibility would be because of your age or an underlying medical condition which puts you at a higher risk for COVID 19.

On April 18, VA will move to Phase 2.

This means anyone 16 and older who lives and works in Virginia will be eligible for the vaccine. Some communities will make the transition to Phase 2 sooner than others.
